Everyone is invited to help. Men, women & children.


Circle will meet after the kitchen cleaning. We are ordering pizza for our lunch.

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Church Council met March 27, 2023

- -2023 Church Supper proceeds went to the projector/screen project, along with a portion of the 2022 proceeds. \$5581.20
- -St. Paul will be participating in a program called "Stewardship for All Seasons". Deb Youngs and Randy Essler will serve on the task force.
- -We will sponsor the Dinner at Camp on Aug. 6, and worship with camp on the 6^{th} .
- -There is a signup sheet in the narthex for council members to bring the offering to the office on Sunday mornings.
- -Pastor Janis will be the Vice Pastor for the Max & Benedict congregations. This will not include Sunday mornings.
- -We will require double signatures on the church accounts.

Church Council met May 11, 2023

- New Full-Time position The Executive Committee met on May 9th to look at a combination of duties to make a full-time position. The position would combine Faith Formation, Treasurer & Secretary into one full-time position. Salary =\$35,600, Benefits=\$10,380. It would add approximately \$5000 to the current budget needs. The Committee recommends that the Council approve the new position. MSC. There was a motion to offer the job to Holly Klemisch. MSC. Holly accepted the new position. The position will start September 1, 2023. Loree will use the summer to transition duties to both Holly and Janis.
- -Accepted the updated Personal Policy.
- -St. Paul's 2023 Synod Assembly delegate is Lisa Haugen. Next meeting is June 21st at 7:00 p.m.

Action Groups - All members of St. Paul's are divided into four Action Groups. Each Action Group oversees church activities for a month. The Action Groups work as ushers, greeters, and communion assistants and serve potlucks, wedding, anniversary, and funeral lunches.

The groups meet the second to the last Sunday in a month to plan for the next month's activities. These brief meetings held after worship in the chapel allow you to sign up for duties of your choosing, on dates when you are available. The Action Group leaders may call on you to fill open duties and to serve or bake for things such as funerals that pop up during your month. We hope that this serves as a meaningful way for our people to engage in the life of the church. Please let us know if you are not sure that you were assigned an Action Group.

Women of St. Paul's:

Every woman that is a member of St. Paul's is a member of the "Women of St. Paul's". This used to be called WELCA, but for the last several years we have not been members of WELCA (Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America.) The women



raise money for youth camp scholarships, items for the church, camp, organizations in town and all over the country. The two main fundraisers are the Bake Sale during The Dicken's Festival and the Raffle during our church Spring Supper.

The women also have a quilting group. The women deep clean the kitchen, clean brass, sell cards and many other works of the church. Please be a part of the women's group.

Women's Circle will meet on **June 7**th, after kitchen cleaning at 9 a.m., and **August 2**nd at 9:30 a.m. We do not meet in July. Everyone is welcome to join us for a Bible study, short meeting, and goodies.

Committees:

The following are the committees that we have at St. Paul's to get the business of the church completed. Let one of the staff know if there is any committee that interests you, and that you would like to be a part of.

Fellowship: Find people to serve fellowship on Sundays, decorate tables for the season or special events, change picture above serving window, make sure that fellowship supplies are available. Money from fellowship is used for supplies, Operation Christmas Child postage, camp, and senior scholarships.

Parish Ed: (pre-6th): Faith formation, which includes Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and other activities and curriculum.

<u>Altar Guild:</u> Change paraments/banners, worship decorations, altar flowers, etc. in the Sanctuary.

Property: Maintains the church and parsonage property. This can be many kinds of projects.

Worship: Decides/discusses worship practices, songs, special guests, any worship activities.

Social Action: Does events and projects to help others. Ex: Little Lunches, Operation Christmas Child, M&M's, Hunger Banks, Sr. Scholarships, etc.

Tech./Audio: All aspects of technology. Computers, sound system, streaming worship.

<u>Rummage Sale:</u> help to plan and organize the annual youth rummage sale fundraiser.

<u>Decorating:</u> Decorate the narthex and/or church for different holidays, especially Christmas.

Finance: Monitor our budget along with the Treasurer and Council.
